### CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WEDNESDAY, APRIL 7, 1999

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, April 7, 1999, at 7:00 o'clock P.M, with Mayor Blake Gosnell presiding, and the following Council members answering roll call: Rich Wilkening, Lyle G. Van Fleet, Douglas L. Glandon, Bob L. Mendenhall, and Jeffrey A. Winn.. (Ed Conrad arrived later.) Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Greg Brower, Sharlene Bos, Kenneth D. Bucklin, Don Northup, Dan Appleget, Laurie Appleget, Mark Seeley, Madonna Shaver, Tony Bos, and Jody Miller.

Mayor Gosnell said items 14 and 16 on the agenda may be dropped for this meeting. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Glandon, that the agenda be approved as adjusted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. (Conrad had not yet arrived.) The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the minutes of the regular Council meeting of March 17, 1999 be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. (Conrad had not yet arrived.) The motion was approved.

#### Council member Conrad arrived.

Mayor Gosnell reviewed Greg Brower's water usage from 6/1/98 through 4/1/99 which reflected usages of from 3700 to 6200, except for 2/1/99 the consumption was 9700 and 3/1/99 it read 11800, making the average usage in gallons the last 11 months to be 5600 gallons; the average usage for the 8 months before the bills in question was 4,237.50 gallons; the gallons used in excess of the average for two months was 13,025, and the cost thereof was \$54.35 for water, \$2.72 tax, and \$9.10 Sewer Operation & Maintenance, for a total of \$66.17. The Mayor asked Mr. Brower if it was true that he had a toilet in the basement that had been running?. The reply was No. The Mayor asked what the Council wanted to do about the situation? Greg Brower said the old meter had registered 6200 for the 4/1 bill (middle of February to middle of March) and he had just read the new meter and it was only 4400 (not the same period of time) in spite of Ron having told him that the old meter tested to be running slow. Mr. Brower also pointed out that his bill included a \$10.00 charge for testing the meter, which had been written on his bill. The Clerk stated that after Ron had given Teri the charge she was unable to get the computer to print it on the bill, was the reason it had been written thereon. The Mayor stated it is the City's responsibility to see that meters are operating correctly, so there should not have been a charge therefor. Counil member Glandon moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that Greg Brower's City utility bill be forgiven in the amount of \$66.17 (for the 13,000 gallons of water, tax and OM) and no late fee or meter testing fee be charged. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: Wilkening. The motion was approved.

Dan and Laurie Appleget appeared before the Mayor and Council and said the last time they were here they talked about purchasing one of two different properties, and that they have purchased ten acres from Stanton Long which is just outside the City limits; and they had the abstracter check records and determined that Cherry Street is open some west of Kelley Street (as shown the Mayor and Council on a map) and that there is also an open alley east of Cherry Street. They think they have everything figured out except the water and sewer; they believe the gas line will go down the alley. They have an Easement for Cherry Street from where it ends in the City, and Pattersons also want to put in a sewer line going out south and tie on to the sewer that joins the Meadowbrook

Lift Station. So if that will work for their sewer, they then have to figure out how to get Water to their site: Phil and Madonna also want to open up additional development for them if they can bring utilities down the street some way. Alliant Utilties will set a transformer in the alley. Dan further said that everybody also has to have a separate water service. He would like the City to run a water line down Cherry Street and they will annex the area of their home, so they can also hook up to City sewer. He said the distance for the water line would be approximately 600 ft. Mayor Gosnell said we don't have money to run 600 ft. of water line, and asked where the closest is presently located. He was told in front of Pattersons' house. Ken Bucklin said depending on where they plan to site their house, Mackey Street might be closer. Engineer Bucklin stated that a 4" watermain could be used if they don't put a fire hydrant on the line, but it would be better to go with a 6" line. Mayor Gosnell said the City could not put in services for only one house, but it would have to be a subdivision that serves more than one house. Council member Conrad asked Madonna Shaver if they have any immediate plans to build. She replied "long term." Council member Glandon indicated he thinks the City ought to do something to encourage growth. The Mayor said he needs to talk with John Wehr if he understands the law correctly - that one person doesn't have a leg to stand on as far as the City putting in water or sewer lines, but if there are three or four houses, the City may be able to put in water through the alley.

Mayor Gosnell told Dan Appleget he would have an answer for him at the next regular meeting, and in the meantime the Water Committee should consider this request, Madonna should let us know what their plans are, and he will talk with SADC. It was pointed out it would be a voluntary annexation for the Applegets. Madonna spoke up and said they would hope to start building by November 1<sup>st</sup>. The Mayor said this subject will be on the next regular meeting agenda.

Mayor Gosnell reported he had talked with Rob Marget in regard to the East County Line property above Keokuk County Abstract. He doesn't know what to do about the facade because one party owns the bottom and another party owns the second floor. There are no quick fixes. Rob was concerned because bricks are falling from the second story. He said when they talked, Rob hadn't remembered his other complaint - Alice Schultz property at 321 East Marion.

Council member Mendenhall moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that a consent agenda for items 7 through 13 be adopted approving all Applications and adopting the necessary Resolutions for approval of Tax Abatements, as follows:

- 7. Application of Bill Smothers for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on new Garage
- 8. Application of Keokuk County Expo for building permit on addition
- 9. Application of Clarence W. and Crystal M. Aldrich for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on a room addition
- 10. Application of Phil and Cyrena Buschmann for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on an addition
- 11. Application of Lyall and Wendy Stuhr for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on a new modular home
- 12. Application of Gary Bain for building permit for sidewalk and deck
- 13. Application of Richard E. and Barbara Sue Coffman for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on a room addition

Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. (Glandon was out of the room at the time of the vote.) The motion and Resolutions were adopted.

Mayor Gosnell reported that Frank Jacobs, a present employee in the Sanitation Department, has submitted his resignation effective April 9<sup>th</sup>, 1999, and that he currently has been on vacation and will not be returning to work. The position has been advertised

and Doug and he will be interviewing prospective candidates and come back to the Council with their recommendation. It was decided that a special Council meeting will be held for that purpose on Monday, April 12, at 5:30 P.M. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that the resignation of Frank Jacobs be accepted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet asked about the storm sewer problem affecting parking on the north side of the Memorial Hall. Don Northup replied that he has talked with Paduke Snakenberg about the same.

Regarding Park and Recreation, Council member Van Fleet said the doors are almost completed at the Pool, although more steel may be needed, which will increase the cost of the estimate. He met with Mark Seeley, of M & M, the low bidder on the tennis courts, last night and they decided that 4" of gravel will be more than enough. We will need to buy gravel and fence off the whole area, and the poles will be obtained. He also reported that two trees in the Park area of the Black Memorial need to be removed and he has retained Dan Appleget to do that for \$100.00 each. The new park benches came in but are not yet assembled.

Jody Miller arrived and apologized for being late. She wanted them to take time to review the basketball/tennis court originally discussed. The donated money she has received includes a \$1700 memorial donation from the family of a girl who was very interested in basketball, and she does not feel she can turn that money over to the City if in fact there will be no basketball court. She said she presently has \$7785.00 and that the Keokuk County State Bank had indicated they would donate to make it an even \$8000.00. Finances for the Tennis Court Fund were discussed and Mayor Gosnell asked Mrs. Miller if she could donate any of the funds she holds for the tennis courts. She said she probably could donate \$4000. Council member Van Fleet told Mrs. Miller he is considering two 20 x 20 basketball areas away from the tennis courts; there is no space for a regulation size basketball court, but he believes they can get two 20 x 20 areas built for 3 on 3 games. He told her he will get back to her on that matter.

Council member Wilkening moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that the required rock for the tennis courts base be purchased as needed from the Keswick Quarry, hauled by Pappy Davis. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Glandon had a draft of a Corporation Line Agreement between Keokuk County and the City in regard to the maintenance of Expo Road, V-45, and Delta Road. This 28E Agreement has an indefinite period of operation but may be terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice. Council member Glandon moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that the Corporation Line Agreement between Keokuk County and the City of Sigourney be approved pending changes in the draft. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Gosnell opened the proposals for the Sanitation/Street pickup to be delivered after July 1<sup>st</sup>. Jack Walker Chrysler-Plymouth-Dodge's proposal was \$17,176.00 and Wagler Motor Co., Inc.'s was \$15,741.00. The Council spent considerable time reviewing the specifications and instructions to bidders, which had been patterned after a Keokuk County Secondary Road Department form. It was determined that neither proposal complied exactly with the specifications. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Glandon, that the low bid of Wagler Motor Co., Inc., be accepted in the amount of \$15,741.00. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, and Winn. Nays: Conrad, Wilkening, and Mendenhall. The Mayor broke the tie by voting Aye. The motion was approved.

Don Northup, employee in the Street Department, wanted to talk about a storage box for the Shop tools. He had in mind a tool cart which may be locked up, and would take better care of tools and would have them all together and could be pulled around the shop to wherever they are working. H & M does not stock such tool carts, but they have one in a catalog for about \$900.00, which he would like to order. The Mayor said that sounded very efficient. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the Street Department be given permission to purchase a tool cart for the Shop. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

In regard to the discussion of a possible R.I.S.E. application for use at the Industrial Park, the estimated cost to extend the road is \$105,000; but SADC wants to run it back an additional 200 ft. That might make it \$200,000 and we would have to come up with \$40,000. Mayor Gosnell said the people involved gave no consideration to the timeliness of our budget; that SADC and Durolast were all aware of the fact that the City was not involved. The application which Pathfinders was to prepare for the City called for 500' of roadway, but SADC wants to go to 700' - 500' access for Durolast and 200' grading beyond the end of the original subdivision. The Mayor said the City is safe on \$20,000 share but that we cannot go beyond that. Council member Glandon stated a possible scenario is that SADC is looking at donated ground for part of the match, and the roadway would be maintained by the City as our donation; he said there could also be heavy truck traffic to the back of the Durolast building. The Mayor asked Engineer Bucklin when the application has to be filed. Mr. Bucklin replied that there is no deadline: that Dale Krauss, with Pathfinders, is waiting for SADC and Durolast to get back to him as to how many jobs would be created, etc. It was decided to table this matter and discuss it again at the special meeting, with the intent of obtaining more information in the interim.

Engineer Bucklin reported that he, Ron Doubek, Rich Wilkening, and Lyle Van Fleet met with Gayle McIntosh of Northway Well & Pump Company to review the options for Well No. 3. He submitted a three page letter, plus drawings, in regard to the same. Mr. McIntosh felt it is possible to repair this well if the existing casing could be removed. He described the procedure, which carries a 50% chance of success, at an estimated cost of \$15,200.00. Council member Van Fleet asked about test wells: he had approached Matt Wehr, C. D. Huffman, and Bob Wehr, who all would agree to such use of their land. The engineer stated there would have to be a letting on a production well. Council member Van Fleet said he feels we need another well, but Well #3 warrants a try. It was discussed how soon Northway would know if they could remove the existing casing or if they could quit before getting too far if it was very evident it would not work. Engineer Bucklin said maybe they can repair Well #3 and then do a test well for a permanent well. Council member Conrad moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that we attempt to repair Well #3 as outlined. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

The Mayor said that Maquire Iron, Inc., the lowest bidder on the water tower painting, will be notified of one well presently being down and that when that is back in service they will be contacted to proceed with the tower work.

Council member Conrad said there was no report from the Wastewater Committee.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Winn, that the claims be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Discussion was had regarding hooking up the Sigourney Ball buildings to the City sewer, at a proposed cost of \$3500.00. Council member Mendenhall moved, seconded by

Council member Van Fleet, that the Sigourney Ball rest rooms and concession stand be hooked up to the City sewer, at the proposed cost of \$3500.00. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Winn. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Conrad moved for adjournment at 8:45 P.M. The second was by Council member Winn.
