CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, JULY 1, 1998

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, July 1, 1998, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., with Mayor Blake Gosnell presiding, and the following Councilmembers answering roll call: Bob L. Mendenhall, Jeffrey A. Winn, Ed Conrad, Rich Wilkening, Lyle G. Van Fleet, and Douglas L. Glandon. Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Gini Garrett, Pamela Hammes, Harold J. Boehm, Gwen Stull, Tony Pitsch, Nathan Yock, Carl S. Mohr, Jimmy Seevers, Ray Schwenke, Carol Fish with SIEDA, Tony Bos, and Eugene Strohman.

The Mayor announced that items 3, 9, 11, 14-B, and 15 could be deleted from the agenda. Councilmember Mendenhall moved, seconded by Councilmember Winn, that the agenda be approved as posted, after certain deletions. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, and Glandon. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Conrad, that the minutes of the Council meeting of June 17, 1998 be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, and Glandon. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Carl Mohr, President of the Board of Trustees, Sigourney Public Library, appeared before the Mayor and Council to explain the request for the Mayor to sign the Real Estate Contract in favor of the Sigourney Public Library. The Isabelle Moore property became available for purchase and the Library Board had several sites under consideration for the possibility of building a new Library. They had considered the SADC lot across from Memorial Hall, but were told that the fill-in after the demolition of the Kilburn Veterinary Clinic might be a problem, and the other site they considered was the one just south of Short Stop. With the Moore site they also have secured an option from Tom Bates and Larry Northup to purchase the old Fire Station. This would be very long term, and they would like to have everything on one floor and handicap accessible. Councilmember Mendenhall moved, seconded by Councilmember Conrad, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the Real Estate contract in favor of Sigourney Public Li-Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Glandon. Nays: Wilkening and The motion was approved.

Pam Hammes and Harold J. Boehm, representing Main Street Sigourney, appeared before the Mayor and Council. Mrs. Hammes distributed new Main Street maps. Mr. Boehm reviewed recent activities of Main Street, including the visitors welcome sign at the intersection of Highways 92 and 149, the plans for directional signs on four corners of the square, plans to participate in the Main Street Iowa booth at the Iowa State Fair, to promote Sigourney area with a Christmas theme, and their recent fundraising auction netted \$6000.00.

Mayor Gosnell stated that he would not allow the first reading of the proposed Curfew Ordinance because he personally was opposed to some parts of the same, particularly times, but that he would open the subject up for discussion from the group or audience. Gwen Stull asked what happened to the Curfew Ordinance that was on the books at the time she was a teenager. Her daughter has a curfew, which is later than that proposed, and she feels that if some parents are not accepting their parental responsibilities that her daughter should not have to be penalized for the same by having to comply with a curfew to cover for irresponsible

parents. Mayor Gosnell said there is nothing for the kids to do here, except the bowling lanes and games at the Legends. Mrs. Stull said she is concerned about them going out of town. Chief Bos stated there has been vandalism and that recently they broke the flag poles by the Court House, and that each one of those costs \$49.00; that there is a group around the Fountain at 2:00 A.M.; that he sent Junior High age students home at midnight, but some were back by 3:00 A.M.; that 90% of the parents do a good job, but the children of the other 10% create problems. Several agreed that it is too bad to punish the good kids for what the bad ones are doing. Mrs. Stull again objected to the curfew hours. Councilmember Wilkening asked her if she thought it should be midnight for high school age students. said that would be okay. Mayor Gosnell added that elementary age and junior high school age students shouldn't be out after 10:30 P.M., but the high school students should be given the midnight curfew. He said if people will not accept responsibility for their own children, then a Curfew Ordinance should come into being, and that he will continue this to the next meeting.

Mayor Gosnell opened the following proposals from CPA firms for the annual audit:

Councilmember Glandon moved, seconded by Councilmember Van Fleet, that Fred Hensel, CPA, be awarded the three-year contract for the City's annual audits, at \$2,975 per year. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, and Glandon. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Wilkening moved, seconded by Councilmember Winn, that the Application of The Fountain Lounge for renewal of their Liquor License be approved and considered timely filed. (Their Dramshop was received prior to expiration of the license, although the other required documents were filed earlier.) Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, Wilkening, Van Fleet, and Glandon. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Glandon reported the Square Project is moving along well, and they have started to put in the water services.

Councilmember Van Fleet reported that the Park is temporarily closed now; that in the June 29th storm we lost the biggest shelter house at the east end of the Park as result of fallen trees; the Pool is empty now to clean it of the storm debris, but they are starting to refill it and may be able to run it faster overnight. The 4th of July Celebration will proceed with everything being held, except for the water fights.

There was no Street and Sanitation Committee report. It was reported that on the Jackson-Laffer Streets Watermain Project, they are now working on the storm sewer phase. There was no Wastewater Committee report.

The City Clerk had alerted the Finance Committee Chairperson and some of the Council members that with the new computer system nothing could be entered into the Summit programs until the 1997-1998 year was closed out, and so she would be unable to enter claims for approval at this meeting. However, she would have them worked up and could read them or the Councilmembers could review each one. (She had everything done by Monday morning that she was required to put in the system for the close of the fiscal year, but as of today Data Technologies had not given her the assistance needed to close out the year. There was a problem because what had originally been entered by their support person when she set up our accounts did not balance with our actual budget, and they were trying to decide if we should just wipe out everything for the 97-98 fiscal year and start over for July 1st.) The Clerk was asked to read the claims, which she did, and answered any questions asked about the same. Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Glandon, that the claims be approved as reviewed. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, Wilkening, Van The motion was approved. Fleet, and Glandon. Nays: None.

Councilmember Glandon reported that today we had received from Triax the Franchise Agreement, along with their check in the amount of \$5,000, and a request for the City to amend the section regarding their acceptance of the same in that it was after the specified sixty days. That will be on the next agenda. He also reported he had called regarding maintenance and the new guy returned his call immediately; their office is moving out of Cedar Rapids, and they have had some technical problems, but they are sending a crew in to try to clear up problems.

The Mayor asked Nathan Yock, in the audience, if he wanted to speak to the Council. Nathan is a Boy Scout who would like to have as his Eagle Scout project repair of a Park Shelter. Councilmember Van Fleet told him to contact him and they would work something out.

Councilmember Conrad asked a general question in regard to notification of high usage. He said he is on the Country Club Board and that they had a leak develop which generated real high usage, but they weren't notified of the same until after the other bills went out, and he wanted to know if there was a written policy regarding notification of high usage. When asked, the Clerk replied that there is no written policy per se, but it has always been the policy of the office to notify the user of a high usage as soon as the same is revealed through meter read-She said she was not informed of all the details ing entries. of the Golf Course situation, except that she was aware that Teri had been in discussion with Ron about the same, and that since their's had been winter packed and estimated, it was probably questionable as to whether there was in fact a leak or if it had been read in error, and to add to the confusion that is the one meter where a subtraction is necessary (for Jim Reynolds.)

Mayor Gosnell asked about Mahaska Street, which is platted, but undeveloped. The trees that went down from there apparently fell into Gale Joe Conrad's yard, and he wanted to know who is responsible. The Mayor wanted the Council to think about it so they could decide something. Councilmember Glandon said just because it is platted doesn't mean we have to maintain the street.

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Mayor Gosnell said he would like to know who put up the barricades at the Needham building - that caused us to buy the building, and he does not want any barricades put up in similar situations without his permission. Councilmember Glandon added that barricades were also placed in front of Jody's Togs & Tan, when the owners could not be reached.

There was some discussion regarding the storm cleanup. The Mayor said we will take care of the stuff on the terraces, with the City crew picking up whenever they can, especially in cases where the property owners have no means of transporting. Councilmember Glandon said the public needs to take care of their own stuff. He also told the group that the Street Department said they could use another chain saw, so he told them to go ahead and get one.

Ray Schwenke appeared before the Mayor and Council in regard to the 30 days permission granted him for live trapping cats, and asked for another 30 days extension. He caught a couple of cats, a coon, and a dog, but he thinks they are doing a better job of keeping their cats at home. Councilmember Glandon stated he had learned that Ray's taking the cats to the farm would be considered transporting abandoned property, so in the future he should call the Police to take the animal to the veterinarian. Jimmy Seevers was with Mr. Schwenke and also asked if he could live trap cats, when Ray is finished with his trap. He was told not yet. He handed the Mayor a copy of the Animal Ordinance from Oskaloosa, which he recommended the City review and consider for a similar adoption. The Mayor said the City had reviewed that Ordinance before we adopted our animal control ordinance.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved for adjournment at 8:25 P.M. The second was by Councilmember Winn.
