CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

July 17, 1985

The City Council met in a regular scheduled Council meeting in the Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall Building as posted and published. This meeting being held July 17, 1985 at 7:30 O'clock P.M. Water fountain at the large shelter at the Legion Park not working.


The fixing of the high diving board at the pool
