CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 4, 1999

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, August 4, 1999, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., with Mayor Pro tem Douglas L. Glandon presiding in the absence of Mayor Gosnell, and the following Council members answering roll call: Rich Wilkening, Lyle G. Van Fleet, Douglas L. Glandon, Bob L. Mendenhall, Jeffrey A. Winn, and Ed Conrad. Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Sharlene Bos, Don Northup, Bill Tremmel, Ralph Bruns, and Kenneth D. Bucklin.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon said items 9 and 7 on the agenda may be canceled for this meeting. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that the agenda be approved as posted, with two deletions indicated. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that the minutes of the regular Council Meeting of July 21, 1999 be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, and Conrad. Nays: None. Abstained: Wilkening and Winn. The motion was approved.

Ralph Bruns appeared before the Council to discuss the matter of his not understanding why he should be expected to pay \$7.00 for sewer for each lot when the same is vacant: that the sewer main is on his property and the Mobile Home Park was approved by the State. Engineer Bucklin affirmed that was true, as to the main on his property and approved by the State. Mr. Bruns said he wants to put in a meter for all lots. Mayor pro tem Glandon replied that if he wants one rate for 10-20 units, we want a flat rate on the sewer. Council member Conrad replied we have no control now. Mr. Bucklin stated that the \$7.00 sewer rate is mandated by the State because of the Revolving Sewer Loan. All attempted to explain to Mr. Bruns that unless the disconnection is made at the collection line, the monthly charge continues even if the water is off. The City Clerk was instructed to mail to Mr. Bruns a copy of the Sewer Ordinance.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon said that items 4 and 5 on the agenda, Barb and Jack Smith and Dorothy Peiffer, both with water drainage problems at their residences, will be carried over.

Council member Van Fleet introduced the Resolution, and moved its adoption, that the Application of Carroll Wood for Tax Exemption on siding, be approved. The second was by Council member Winn. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The Resolution was adopted.

Council member Conrad read to the group a Legal Notice prepared by City Attorney John N. Wehr for the Council's consideration to record for the purpose of alerting property owners via abstracts that a new Zoning Ordinance was adopted. (The old Ordinance is of record, but this one is too lengthy to record in full.) Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that the Legal Notice prepared by the City Attorney, regarding adoption of the Zoning Ordinance, be recorded. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet reported he had heard nothing regarding the Memorial Hall electrical bids, and he had nothing else to report on the building. The Municipal

LEGAL NOTICE

To all property owners and all Buyers and Sellers of real estate located within the City limits of Sigourney and within two miles of the Sigourney City limits. You are hereby notified that the City of Sigourney has adopted a new Zoning Ordinance to provide adequate light and air, to prevent overcrowding of land, to avoid undue concentration of population, to regulate the use of land, and to promote the health, morals, safety and general welfare in the City of Sigourney, Iowa.

The sections of the Zoning Ordinance are: Purpose; Definitions, Establishment of Districts; Official Zoning Map; General Provisions; "A-1" Agricultural Districts; "R-1" One Family Residence Districts, "R-2" One and Two-Family Residence Districts, "R-3" Multi-Family Residence Districts; "B-1" Retail Business Districts; "B-2" General Business Districts; "I-1" Industrial Districts; Signs; Special Provisions; Adult Uses; Additional Requirements, Exception, and Modifications; Zoning Administration; Planning and Zoning Commission; Board of Adjustment; District Changes and Ordinance Amendments; Penalty; and Severability.

Swimming Pool will close at 6:00 P.M. August 21st; there had been a water problem which caused it to be closed for one day. The tennis courts are poured and the basketball court is poured. They will set the poles next week. They need to get the fence up. After the pool gets shut down, he is going to move the fence and make some parking closer to the basketball court to keep people from parking cars on the grass.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon opened the proposals for concrete work on the pole building:

Cavin Concrete was the low bidder. Mayor Pro tem Glandon recommended that since the plumbing and electrical still need to be done in the building, that the approach under Alternate #1 could be postponed until later. Council member Mendenhall moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that Cavin Concrete be awarded the concrete work on the interior of the pole maintenance building, and that the approach concrete, Alternate #1 on the Specifications, be postponed until later. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. Council member Van Fleet stated he was voting yes under protest because he felt there are other things the money should be used for. Council member Glandon reminded him that money for this building has come from the Road Use Fund and from Sanitation, which is a part of the General Fund. The motion was approved.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon opened the quotes for water and sewer hookup for the pole building:

Tremmel Backhoe was the lower proposal. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that Tremmel Backhoe Service's quote for water and sewer at the new pole maintenance building, be accepted, in the amount of \$5,950.00.

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Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. The motion was approved. Mayor Pro tem Glandon told Bill Tremmel that he would expect him to work with Dan Cavin, who will be doing the concrete. He also instructed the City Clerk to direct a letter to Mr. Cavin advising him of the award and who would be doing the water and sewer.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon opened the sealed bids on the 1984 Chevrolet Silverado pickup, which has been replaced with a 1999 Ford pickup:

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the bid of Don J. Lane, in the amount of \$1800.00 for the 1984 Chevrolet Silverado pickup, be accepted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Pro tem Glandon and employee Don Northup reported that Safety-Kleen discovered that the tar in the barrels is too thick to pump to a truck; it is more like sludge, and it may cost \$5000 to move. Ralph Bruns wants the barrels removed, since they are on his land. A few years ago we were looking at \$20,000 to dispose of the same, but the methods of handling to meet environmental controls on this type of product have improved. If we get involved in a legal action over the removal or spillage, we could spend a lot more money on attorney fees. The City of Oskaloosa would take the barrels and contents, at no cost, but we would have to pay a crane to load them on a truck, and should the barrels leak on the way, we would still have a problem. There are about 1700 gallons in one barrel and less in the other, perhaps 500 gallons. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that we retain Safety-Kleen to clean out both barrels of old tar. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Engineer Bucklin reported the work done on Well #3: they proposed to drive the casing down and drill out to stop stuff from falling in - they drilled down to the original depth, but fine, muddy shale kept falling, so they put in a pump; after it ran clean they kept moving down and pumped clear water and after driving the casing down they pumped 60 gallons a minute; below the 80' level they can hear it run in, so they have hopes of a high producing well; they are at the point of being able to put the screen in and gravel pack and will test pump before grouting and after: it looks now like they will be able to save the well, but the big unknown is what water production will be. At least it's looking better than a week or two ago.

Bill Tremmel asked about the time table on the two leaking valves on which he was asked to quote a few weeks ago. When Ron Doubek first called him he said it was a hurry up deal, so Bill wants to know why he was told that, but a month later only one valve has been replaced at this time. Council member Wilkening said he didn't realize it was a "get it done tomorrow" thing. Mayor pro tem Glandon said he was sure they did the one that was creating the largest leak first, but he thought they had both been done and the street put back. Mr. Glandon also said he has had a number of complaints about the loose rock on concrete on Spring Street, at the intersection with Keller, and he had talked with Roger Bird and asked him to clean it up, since it is a dangerous situation for children going and coming from the Pool on their bikes. He checked thereafter and it hadn't been cleaned up. Don Northup spoke up and said there are lots of holes in the streets. Mayor Pro tem Glandon said two are over a year old, and Bill Tremmel fills them

in. Bill said he even did one in his residential neighborhood, which had not been his work, but he got tired of driving over the hole. Mr. Glandon said it has been a month since he told Roger to clean up the rock on Spring Street and to concrete the holes in the streets, and a month before that he talked with Paduke about the latter. He will, therefore, have drafted a letter to the property owners telling them they have 14 days after the date of the letter to contact their contractor to have the holes filled, or the City will fix the same and bill them. It was further discussed that it should be considered to put in the Ordinance that any penetration in our streets should be replaced within five days.

Engineer Bucklin reported that he and Dale Kraus had discussed with IDED, and Dale had talked with Doug and the Mayor and recommended changing the ratio in the Sewer CDBG pre-application from 60-40 to 50-50. If we should get that award it would be within two years and the same quantity of sewer projects. They determined that the last application had not asked for the highest priorities in the report, and at one place a 29th priority was included and there was no justification therefor. He said he now wants the Council to work on highest priorities, and he suggested including in the first four priorities from the old ball field to the east plant and back to the Fairlane Motel, lining of the sewer under Highway 92 from Shuffleton past Casey's, and repair of sewer on Ringgold Street.

Don Northup reported that about the first of November SEMCO Landfill will take absolutely no cardboard and will fine \$100 per ton for any they find. He also said that Ron Cox has offered in the past to bring a roll-off for cardboard - the appliance dealers will have to break it down, load it up and take it down to his roll-off. It would take our crew considerable time to take all their cardboard to Cox. Maybe we should check with Cox and see if we can arrange for a roll-off here and get the people used to it.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the claims be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, and Conrad. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

The City Clerk had written a note to each Council member explaining the delay and problems in financial reports for May and June; that she has been working very hard on them and devoting many extra hours, but there were numerous errors created by a former employee, that it almost seems impossible for her to arrive at a May balance. She asked if she could contact Fred Hensel, CPA about the same, if she hasn't succeeded by early next week. They gave her permission to seek his help, if needed.

Don Northup reported that in regard to the Sigourney Ball grant that after meeting with Dale Kraus that specifically a vertical structure doesn't meet the criteria for Sigourney Ball at this time, and that maybe they could work with other things at the Park, like the bathhouse, shelter, etc., with the ball field, for next year.

Council member Van Fleet moved for adjournment at 8:07 P.M. The second was by Council member Winn.
