## CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 1999

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, September 1, 1999, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., with Mayor Blake Gosnell presiding, and the following Council members answering roll call: Lyle G. Van Fleet, Douglas L. Glandon, Bob L. Mendenhall, Jeffrey A. Winn, Ed Conrad, and Rich Wilkening. Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Sharlene Bos, Karla Grant, Don Northup, Jerry Smithart, John N. Wehr, Jack Vallandingham, Kenneth D. Bucklin, and Art Koffron..

The Mayor said when Larry Northup arrives at the meeting, he would like to work him into the agenda instead of having him wait until the end. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that the agenda be approved as posted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Winn, that the minutes of the regular Council meeting of August 18, 1999 be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Gosnell opened the public hearing on the Cable Television transfer. There was no comment regarding the same from anyone in the audience. The City Clerk reported that the only call she had was from Mrs. Wayne Flanegin, 620 West Jackson, who had called Triax this morning and verified that their dishes will remain on the Flanegin property, and that they don't have to worry about an assignment of lease or renegotiate the same because she was told Triax and Mediacom were of the same corporate ownership. City Attorney Wehr reported on his review of all the transfer legal documents and that Mediacom is still to upgrade our system and perform pursuant to the franchise with Triax. Mayor Gosnell said Triax is located in about 20 communities in this area. Council member Van Fleet introduced the Resolution, and moved its adoption, Approving the Transfer and Assignment of the Cable Television Franchise with Triax Midwest Associates, L.P. to Mediacom Iowa LLC. The second was by Council member Glandon. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The Resolution was adopted. Mayor Gosnell closed the public hearing at 7:10 P.M.

Jack Vallandingham was in the audience and had requested the City close the alley north of 900 South East Street, because there is no access to the same. He plans to build a new house at that location and thought now would be the time to legally close the alley. He was told that in some years the City has not been closing any alleys because of the utilities or need therefor. John Wehr said it would be possible to convey the alley and reserve the right to place any sewer or water lines as may be needed in the future. Mr. Vallandingham was asked if his new house will be near this said alley. He said no, that whether it is open or closed will not affect his building. The Council then felt that they would have no good reason to close the alley when that has not been their pattern, and that he would have the use of the same without the payment of taxes thereon, but the City would still have a place for utilities if need be. Council member Glandon moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that the request of Jack Vallandingham to close the alley north of 900 South East Street, be denied. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: Mendenhall. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that the Application of Jack and Mary S. Vallandingham for building permit and Application for Tax Exemption on a new house be approved. It was called to their attention that the

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Zoning Administrator is out of town and did not have opportunity to review this Application. The question was asked why do we have a Zoning Administrator if the Council is going to approve Applications that he hasn't seen? The motion was rescinded and the agenda item was postponed until the next meeting.

Karla Grant appeared before the Mayor and Council to request a variance from the Zoning Ordinance to enable her to build a six foot privacy fence at the property she just purchased at 810 South Stuart Street. She explained the problems she is having containing one of her dogs. She was asked to put her request in writing and the same will be continued until the next meeting.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Glandon, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign a Quit Claim Deed in favor of David and Karen Rains for the portion of Woodin Street which had been vacated many years ago but for which that property owner had not obtained a Deed. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that 1.) the record show the satisfactory completion of Angie Alderson's probationary period as Deputy City Clerk and a .25 per hour increase retroactive to August 27, 1999, and 2.) the record show the satisfactory completion of Sherrie Casper's probationary period as Office Assistant and .25 per hour increase effective September 4, 1999. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved. Mayor Gosnell asked the City Clerk to see that Angie gets enrolled in the Municipal City Clerk Institute.

Mayor Gosnell advised the Council that Mr. Atwood delivered his bid for the Memorial Hall electrical service the day after our last meeting, when the bids were due. The Mayor asked John Wehr if we could open the late bid now, since we had received no others, and bypass a re-letting. Architect Art Koffren went out to his car to bring in a copy of the Project Manual and read to the group 5.3 Acceptance of Bid (Award) A. It is the intent of the Owner to award a Contract to the lowest responsible Bidder provided the Bid has been submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Bidding Documents and does not exceed the funds available. The Owner shall have the right to waive any informality or irregularity in any Bid or Bids received and to accept the Bid or Bids which, in his judgment, is in his own best interest. The estimated cost was between \$27,000 and \$32,000, and a Performance Bond was requested. Mayor Gosnell asked if the bid is more than \$25,000, are we okay or not? The Architect said pursuant to the Acceptance of Bid (Award) paragraph that he had just read, we would be. The Mayor then proceeded to open the envelope which contained an Atwood Electric Proposal, in the amount of \$29,877.00, to be paid within 30 days after invoice date. There was no bid security attached. Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that the Proposal of Atwood Electric for the new service entrance and partial rewiring improvements for Memorial Hall, in the amount of \$29,877.00, be accepted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet reported that the pool has been closed, and there are some inspection deficiencies that must have a response within 30 days of the date. The boys got the basketball poles and goal and hoop erected, and he asked Don Northup to paint the lines, a circle with the machine. He said there has been a lot of use of the Park, with at least 200 on a recent Sunday. He has had some requests again for reservations, but he still believes that should be handled on a first come, first serve basis.

Mayor Gosnell said the Pool rescue is what got us inspected and that he has copies, which he will turn in, of the lifeguards' incident reports. They did what they were supposed to do and accomplished a successful rescue and resuscitation; the lifeguard who dove in did

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an exemplary job. The girl rescued was over her head and had never been in the deep water before. He further told the group that such incident was reportable to the State

Don Northup reported that since SEMCO raised the dumping fee to \$25.00 a ton, and it has gone from \$18.00 to \$22.00 to \$25.00 in a relatively short period of time, he wondered if the City would want to start considering the increase of dumpster fees. Today they calculated two hours of wages for the two of them, and only mileage around town, and they were about to the break-even point on dumpsters they handled during that period of time. We are barely getting by cost-wise and the rates need to be considered and raised, at least give it some serious consideration.

Council member Glandon said that Safety-Kleen could not pump out the tanks, it was so thick, so he asked Don Northup to report on the latest. Mr. Northup said the final options are 1.) we do it ourselves and call for transportation and to get the barrels and the barrels up would be \$6500 and that wouldn't count our labor, and they aren't too thrilled about doing the job, 2.) hire it done; have Safety-Kleen and they do everything; an Illinois crew that cleans barrels would cost \$9300.00 for an eight hour day, and no motel; going further and getting the barrels scraped clean would require four men and \$10,000, or \$40.00 an hour per man, plus the fee. Council member Glandon said he thinks we ought to clean it up and get rid of the barrels. It is not classified as hazardous, but it might be to us to try to do the job, and Safety-Kleen takes it from the cradle to the grave. Council member Glandon moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that Safety-Kleen be hired to empty the two barrels of old road oil, scrape out, and clean up the same. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Engineer Bucklin said he sent Sammons Construction Phil Buschmann's claim for damages, and he believes they still have to settle with Sigourney TV & Appliance and Dollar General. Council member Conrad said they also missed one spot where the concrete needed to be replaced - by the Main Street office.

Council member Glandon reported that all the street patches have been made, except on Spring Street, since that project has not yet been accepted, and there are two near the middle school. There is still one other valve not replaced yet either.

Ken Bucklin said the traffic signal poles are rusting and they could be cleaned and repainted. He sent the spec sheet again to Sammons Construction, although he will probably send it back to Atwood Electric to take care of, since the warranty is for a two year period. Don Northup brought up the problem with the street light base at the Coast-to-Coast awning: people are using it for a trash can. They discussed cleaning it out and capping it until such time as the permanent light may be put in place. The engineer assured him there would be no hot wires if they reach in to remove the trash and suggested removing a panel on the side for such purpose.

Larry Northup arrived at the meeting and in behalf of the Keokuk County State Bank requested permission to block off the street in front of the Bank, the half block to Kapple Dental, on Friday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, so they could erect a tent for an appreciation party honoring Rob and Sally Marget and Helen Marget. He said no alcohol would be served: they plan coffee and donuts or rolls in the morning, a lunch, and coffee and cake in the afternoon and they would probably operate until about 4:00-5:00 P.M. Mayor Gosnell said he would talk with the Kapples and if it is not a problem then they could block the street off from Spring Street to Marion Street. He further said for what the Margets have done for the City we should bend over backwards for them.

The Council each had a list of customers that do not have the new touch pad electronic read meters, although it was discovered it was not accurate because it included the meters on the Square which had been replaced last year. Council member Mendenhall asked how many meters are on the shelf now that haven't been installed. The reply was just

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what Ron thought would be needed for replacements. Ron would like to purchase 200 meters now at \$78.00 each, for a total of \$15,600, which quote is from U. S. Filter. Council member Glandon said he had occasion to talk with the Water Superintendent at Oskaloosa and they are on the Sensus program and they purhased their meters from Municipal for considerably less. Mayor Gosnell said he and Council member Wilkening will talk with Ron about this meter purchase.

Engineer Bucklin reported the news regarding Well #3 is not so good. They have put the screen in but have not grouted; what they had hoped to do was gravel pack above the fractured area and get water from there; the shale looked like wet concrete and they are getting a lot of shale, so it is probably plugged in the upper part, and they are only getting water from the lower part; the bottom was filled with clean gravel; the question is that 50 gallons a minute may be the best to expect and that was after a six hour pump test. July 1st the problem got worse because of the effective Legislature rule changes on acquiring or condemning real estate. If we move over we have to buy some new land; we can't move more than 20' east or north, and maybe a little further west. He is almost of the opinion that we ought to finish and pump what we can get from Well #3 but go ahead with a new production well somewhere else. He said it would cost as much to abandon that well as to put it into use. It may have a short life, but he would hope that pump could maintain 30 gallons a minute. That led to some further discussion with the low pumpage and possible options for drillings, but he feels we should keep it until we get something more productive. Council member Glandon said Northway wanted to see our pumpage records for the wells but wasn't able to, so he wonders if similar problems may be developing in the other wells. Engineer Bucklin said that would be a mass of papers, but he could send someone up to copy the static water levels and pumpage report records. He suggested looking further up by Yenrougis. He would like for Roy Hesseman (formerly with Layne-Western, and most recently with a Company that went bankrupt, through no fault of Roy, so he is currently not employed) to give us a look and get a third opinion as to the most likely site. Council member Wilkening moved, seconded by Council member Glandon, to keep Well #3 in production. (They said it may not be great, but to go ahead and use it as a backup.) Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays: None. The motion was approved. Mr. Bucklin said he will get an idea from Roy Hesseman as to where they might go.

There was nothing to report from the Wastewater Committee.

The June and July financial reports were before the Mayor and Council, so those are finally up to date. There were no questions.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Conrad, that the claims be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Van Fleet, Glandon, Mendenhall, Winn, Conrad, and Wilkening. Nays. None. The motion was approved.

John Wehr reported he had talked with Jerry Wohler, Chairperson of the Planning and Zoning Commission, and will ask them to look at the privacy fence, as well as the Clark Street automotive question.

Mayor Gosnell said he wanted to remind the Council that the Ordinances need to be recodified, which is to be done every five years, and it is past that time.

Council member Glandon asked to go back to the Water Department pumpage reports, and suggested Council member Wilkening ask Ron to do that.

Engineer Bucklin stated that on October 14<sup>th</sup> they plan to hold a seminar conducted by Jim Graham, regarding the new acquisition and condemnation law. He would encourage our City Attorney, Council member Mendenhall, or anyone else who would like to

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attend, to do so. It will involve a noon meal, so they would like to know in advance approximately how many will be attending.

Council member Van Fleet reported that the Sale Barn is building something along Warren Street, which may be on our property; he will talk with C. D. Huffman.

Council member Wilkening said he had a complaint from a neighbor who shares an alley, about the sidewalk at 404 South Stone being busted up. Council member Van Fleet said he will talk with Herbert Bruty, property owner, about the matter.

Council member Winn said he had a phone call about a prior nuisance on South Street accumulating again.

Council member Van Fleet moved for adjournment at 8:40 P.M. The second was by Council member Winn.

Mayor Gosnell shook hands with those present, in that this was his last Council meeting prior to his resignation date.
