CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 1998

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, September 2, 1998, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., with Mayor Blake Gosnell presiding, and the following Councilmembers answering roll call: Rich Wilkening, Lyle G. Van Fleet, Douglas L. Glandon, and Bob L. Mendenhall. Councilmembers Jeffrey A. Winn and Ed Conrad were both absent. Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Sharlene Bos, Dick de Regnier, John Wilkening, Trudy Welter, and Allan Glandon.

Mayor Gosnell stated that item 10 on the agenda, Zoning Ordinance, could be dropped for this meeting. Councilmember Wilkening moved, seconded by Councilmember Van Fleet, that the agenda be approved as posted after dropping one item for tonight. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Mendenhall, that the minutes of the regular Council meeting of August 19, 1998 be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Trudy Welter, representing the Historic Preservation Commission, appeared before the Mayor and Council with her proposed budget for the grant applications, as follows:

Mrs. Welter explained in detail her foregoing worksheets with her recommendation that we go for all the grants and see what will be awarded to us. Mayor Gosnell emphasized that the City will not be putting additional monies (other than the tax asking for Memorial Hall Restoration) into the project - that at the last meeting he recommended pulling in the reins and not even applying for the upcoming CDBG for sewer projects. Mrs. Welter reviewed again how some grants can be used as the matching funds for other grants. She further stated that we can apply, but we can always back off if necessary, and that she feels we should look at these grant opportunities as potential funds to reduce future City costs for the project. Councilmember Glandon expressed his feeling that we should go for all of them. Without voting action, Mayor Gosnell told Mrs. Welter to go for all of the grants.

Mayor Gosnell explained to John Wilkening that the reason he had written and asked him to attend this Council meeting was that at the last meeting they had discussed the vehicles on his property and the rodents in the area as result thereof, and that he and the Council wanted to talk with him about what they think they might be able to do to get the vehicles off his property and get it cleaned up; that he knows of somebody who will take the metal for moving all of the vehicles. John Wilkening replied that he has plans for the vehicles and he will have them crushed. Gosnell asked him what kind of time frame he had in mind. Wilkening replied this Fall. Mayor Gosnell said he can put him in touch with someone who can help. John Wilkening replied that he will try first by himself, even though he probably won't get much out of them. Mayor Gosnell asked if there were any questions? Mr. Wilkening replied, not at this time, maybe later on. Mayor Gosnell emphasized that the City would like to help, and could he give us a time plan? John Wilkening's reply was by the end of November. Mayor Gosnell told him that if there is anything we can do to let us know: that we want to help as much as we can and some neighbors also want to help. He thanked Mr. Wilkening for coming to the meeting.

Allan Glandon told the group that the tornado siren malfunctioned during the routine testing procedures on August 3, 1998. Thereafter a representative of Fesler's Inc. checked the siren and removed two circuit modules, which he sent to the factory to be checked and repaired. The representative said that if the modules weren't the cause of the problem then the next step would be to check the parts on top of the pole. When the modules were reinstalled the siren still didn't rotate, so again the Fesler representative contacted a factory technician, who walkedhim through several tests, which showed that the problem is at

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the top of the pole. They also said it was likely struck by lightning. Our insurance coverage on the siren has a \$1,000.00 deductible. The representative said the siren will probably need a new motor and microswitch. He recommended that Dickinson Company, Oskaloosa, do the repairs since they are familiar with this kind of work and have the equipment to do it, and his estimate was:

Duane Atwood was also contacted about repairing the siren. Duane thought he would be able to replace the motor and microswitch at the top of the pole if the City ordered the parts. Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Mendenhall, that the City proceed with ordering the motor and microswitch inside motor for the tornado siren and have Atwood Electric install the same. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Mendenhall, that the Application of The Pizza Ranch for renewal of their beer permit, be approved. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Van Fleet introduced the Resolution, and moved for its adoption, to approve the Application of Patricia Miletich for Tax Exemption on remodeling a house she recently purchased. The second was by Councilmember Wilkening. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The Resolution was adopted.

Councilmember Glandon introduced the following Resolution and moved for its adoption:

AUTHORIZATION RESOLUTION No. 9-2-98-2

WHEREAS, the City of Sigourney at the Council meeting of August 19, 1998, authorized the City administration present to inspect the proposed sweeper for purchase on Friday, August 21, 1998, to purchase the same by lease-purchase, if appropriate, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and certain Councilmembers who inspected said sweeper deemed that the 1991 Elgin Premier Pelican, Model #1040877, Serial #104227, would be a timely purchase of the same from Eddy-Walker Equipment Co. in that the sweeper we have been using is down for repairs and which repairs would cost almost as much as the value of the sweeper, if traded in, and

WHEREAS, although Eddy-Walker Equipment Co. offered to sell said sweeper to the City of Sigourney on either a two-year or a three-year lease-purchase plan, the administration present deemed it appropriate to purchase the same for cash and borrow the funds from the local Banks, and -4- Minutes of Sigourney City Council Meeting of September 2, 1998

WHEREAS, both the Keokuk County State Bank and Central Valley Savings Bank agreed to lend to the City of Sigourney one-half the purchase price of said sweeper, or \$18,200, at 5.75% interest, for two years, which requires monthly checks to both Banks in the amount of \$803.25, and

WHEREAS, payment needed to be made to Eddy-Walker Equipment Co. upon receipt of their invoice, and both Banks had loan documents ready for signing on August 26, 1998, at which time the Mayor and City Clerk signed notes as above described at both Banks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the administrative decision to purchase the 1991 Elgin Premier Pelican street sweeper, and take delivery of the same on August 21, 1998, and to pay for the same by City check on August 26, 1998, and for the Mayor and City Clerk to have executed the Fixed Rate Promissory Notes therefor on said date, be hereby expressly authorized, allowed, and approved by this Council.

The second was by Councilmember Van Fleet. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The Resolution was adopted.

Councilmember Van Fleet reported that MotorIoway 1998(TM) will be in Sigourney on Monday morning, October 5th, between about 8:00-9:00 A.M. They will be displaying 160 cars and will need three sides of the square and possibly north and south one-half block on Jefferson Street. The cars will be backed in to the parking spaces. Local people are also invited to display their vintage or collector cars, and they too will need the parking lot for three or four semis with support equipment. He was also asking in behalf of the Chamber of Commerce for permission to block off three sides of the square and barricade the same for the hour that this car club will be in Sigourney. Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Glandon, that the Chamber of Commerce be given permission to block off and barricade three sides of the Sigourney Square, and possibly one-half block north and south on Jefferson Street on Monday morning, October 5, for the display of the MotorIoway 1998(TM) vehicles, which caravan plans to be in Sigourney between 8:00 - 9:00 A.M. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Councilmember Glandon reported the Square Project is moving right along. Dick de Regnier had asked to speak to the Mayor and Council to express his concern, not so much for the damages already done, but the possibility of future damages with wet basements in businesses around the square. He said the trench is filled with rock as opposed to dirt and the rock has a tendency to permit water to percolate rather than dirt. He feels that the City ought to have that changed before the project is accepted, because the water and sewer lines both have tendencies to break, and with crushed rock, rather than soil, there will be more problems. He said he is not an engineer but it seems practical to put in dirt instead of rock because of the propensity for future problems, and asked that his remarks be made a part of the minutes. The following is his letter:

I am here tonight at your council meeting of 9/2/98 to express my concern for the potential for further water damage to the finished office in the basement of 117 S. Jefferson St.

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You know that the trench that now rings the square has been backfilled with washed rock. You also know that this trench has the water main and the storm sewer in it. You have been made aware of the fact that in the last three weeks water has come into buildings on the square via this rock-filled trench.

I understand that the city has yet to accept the project. The day will come when it does. Given the propensity for water and sewer lines to break and asphalt to crack, we can anticipate further water damage to our building in the future because water percolates through rock faster and deeper than through dirt. This is more true in our part of the state because we have so much clay in our dirt. The clay has a tendency to seal over and not allow water to percolate.

I would urge the council to have the rock removed and replaced with dirt while there is yet time to do so.

I would ask that my remarks be made a part of the record in your meeting minutes.

Councilmember Glandon stated that he had discussed this problem with Engineer Bucklin regarding the east side of the square, the lowest area inspected, and a lateral drain was considered at the trench line for removal of the water. Mayor Gosnell told Mr. de Regnier that we are keenly aware of things that might happen, and he appreciated Dick coming up and taking time to talk with us. Dick de Regnier stated that it is a worthy project and he wants it done well so we won't have this problem.

Under Memorial Hall, Councilmember Van Fleet said there is a slight problem with the new roof - we used the old vent system and the old vents are shot and the old turbines don't hold the water out; we may need a new turbine system so rain doesn't blow in. He will get a quote tomorrow. There are probably four to be done and he has no idea of the cost. He will call everybody when he gets a figure, because it has to be taken care of. Councilmember Van Fleet said he hasn't gone any further on the insulation problem. Councilmember Glandon suggested he wait until the electrical is done. Councilmember Van Fleet considered laying conduit of what we think we might need in the attic. Mayor Gosnell said to hold off on the insulation, with the ventilation system needing to be done.

Councilmember Van Fleet, as Chairperson of the Park and Recreation Committee, reported the Municipal Pool is shut down for the season. He also said he has had a number of inquiries about the shelter in the Park. Mayor Gosnell said he has had probably 15 calls about the shelter in the Park, from people having reunions, and they don't understand why it hasn't been put back up: he said he suggested to some that they rent the Main Street/Chamber tent to put on the concrete slab. Councilmember Van Fleet said he has someone who will donate a couple of trees. He had Donnie make a sweep to the road to the lift station; no more black dirt is gone; and he had nothing to report on T-ball or tennis courts. Mayor Gosnell said he wanted to talk about T-ball. He attended the Sigourney Ball meeting and there are two things that he wanted to discuss with the Council: 1.) amount of space for a third ball field, and 2.) how they will reroute and connect to City sewer when they redo the bath rooms and concession stand from their minimal septic system - that he was approached about

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hookups. They have talked about moving the bath rooms and concession stand to one location, and they will probably talk with us when their plans are firm.

Mayor Gosnell said there is a lot more parental participation, and leadership now in Sigourney Ball, and they are fairly well off, which is a good thing since they are at a turning point. The upper field is good enough for Pony League, girls' and boys' ball, but too small for Little League. They are talking about using Expo for some. The situation on the bottom fields is too small and they are looking at ways to improve the whole program; he thinks we should cooperate with them and make the whole area more of an asset: Sigourney Ball has reorganized with a whole new administration and they are very receptive and the City should take advantage and work with them.

Councilmember Glandon reported the tires on the 1991 dump truck need to be replaced, at a total cost of \$1612.80. The Council was amazed that those being replaced are the original tires, and without voting action it was assumed they will go with Phelps' State bid price, mounted. Councilmember Glandon also reported that the overhead door at the Shop needs to be replaced and they had two quotes from Overhead Door Company in Des Moines and in Ottumwa and the Ottumwa one was about \$400 less, at \$1529.00, for 12'2" x 12'1", for insulated galvanized steel exterior sections. Mayor Gosnell said he doesn't think we need to have an insulated door, but it should be installed. Councilmember Van Fleet expressed his opinion that we should have a fiberglass door which would flex, and the track could be realigned. Mayor Gosnell told them not to do anything until he talks with FEMA.

Councilmember Glandon, Chairperson of Streets and Sanitation, also asked what we are going to do about the recycle truck? He further said if businesses start to recycle cardboard, we can't handle it.—"He has a ballpark figure of \$22,000 for a truck. Cox Sanitation would charge \$5.00 per unit per month. Eddy—Walker also has a 1-1/2 ton truck with tilt chassis that could be used with changed boxes. Councilmember Glandon will prepare specifications and obtain quotes on a truck for recycling.

Councilmember Glandon requested the City Clerk to put on the next agenda the request of Glen Bakehouse to cut the curb for a driveway.

There was nothing to report under Water Committee. Mayor Gosnell told the group of the injuries of Ron Doubek's younger son in an accident with his motorcycle early Sunday morning - that he is in bad shape (paralyzed and on a respirator, one ear was off, but apparently no broken bones or internal injuries unless the cervical vertebrae are causing the paralysis, and when the swelling starts to go down they hope to determine that) and Ron has been at the Cedar Rapids hospital since Sunday morning. Roger Bird is doing the morning rounds, and we are trying to get by as best we can. He will talk with Ken Bucklin tomorrow to see if Nick Hammes could do locates. Someone else suggested that perhaps Audie Foster could be excused from school to fill in during the time Ron is out.

Councilmember Wilkening said he and Councilmember Conrad haven't gotten together to report regarding interpretation of Ordinance re multiple users on one line, but his personal opinion is that we have the Ordinance stating there should be one meter per household. Mayor Gosnell said we need to enforce it. Councilmember Van Fleet said he has a rental property on Jefferson

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Street where the water comes from Main Street and that the School re-buried it under their parking area at Hickory and Jefferson, but he has a signed Agreement with the other two property owners on the same line (the Church and what had been the daycare) and they all three have their own meters and there have been no problems. The Mayor said each place needs a meter to prevent any back-siphoning, and also there would be no problem in shutting someone off if each unit was on a separate line and meter. The Mayor asked Councilmember Wilkening if he thought he and Councilmember Conrad could have their recommendations by the next meeting.

There was no Wastewater Committee report.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved, seconded by Councilmember Wilkening, that the claims be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Wilkening, Van Fleet, Glandon, and Mendenhall. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Gosnell told the Council that Governor Branstad will be in Sigourney Tuesday, September 29th, and he would be glad to have any of the Council volunteer to be in the welcoming group. also asked if anyone knew what happened to the barricades that had been at the Needham building sidewalk and street? No one realized they were missing. Councilmember Mendenhall reminded everyone that the increased assessed valuation is the reason for the increased taxes, when our basic tax asking remained the same at \$8.10/\$1000. He also hopes that we may reduce our tax asking next fiscal year. Mayor Gosnell said the work on the piping at Well #2 has increased production greatly. Councilmember Van Fleet told that someone asked him about obtaining water from The Mayor replied that surface water requires Yenrougis Lake. a lot more testing and higher costs, although we might sometime look in that area for a deep well. Councilmember Wilkening reported that Janice DeVooght, at 508 North Shuffleton Street, is not mowing her yard and the weeds are waist high. The Mayor replied that he has noticed that and other problems there and that he will again write to her.

Councilmember Van Fleet moved for adjournment at 8:40 P.M. The second was by Councilmember Wilkening.
