### CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA MINUTES OF REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1999

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, November 3, 1999, with Mayor Douglas L. Glandon presiding, and the following Council members answering roll call: Bob L. Mendenhall, Jeffrey A. Winn, Rich Wilkening, and Lyle G. Van Fleet. Council member Ed Conrad was absent. Others present, in addition to the City Clerk, were Don Northup, Jerry Smithart, Melissa Bird, Peg Eversmeyer, Shirley Woods, Ed Woods, Ron Kerr, Sherry Kerr, Mark Bruns, Judy S. Bruns, John I. Ballensky, Willis Jaacks, John N. Wehr, Allan Glandon, Tracy Donald, Kenneth D. Bucklin, and Alana Lemons.

Council member Winn moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that the agenda be approved as posted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the minutes of the regular Council meeting of October 20, 1999, be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Wilkening moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that the minutes of the special Council meeting of October 22, 1999, be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Glandon asked City Attorney John Wehr about the nuisance possibility in regard to the vicious animals under our present Ordinance. Mr. Wehr advised that if a nuisance is declared then the time to remedy the same has to be spelled out. Mayor Glandon added that there is no grandfather clause. The City Attorney explained that protracted area, where if you have an animal described as dangerous there is a period of time for removal of the same. The discussion reviewed the events of some years ago when the City declared a particular pit bull dog a nuisance; it was declared a nuisance and was removed from the City, however, the owners ultimately brought in another one even more vicious. Council member Mendenhall added that if they don't comply when a nuisance has been declared, the property owner is subject to the Municipal Infraction Ordinance and every day is a new offense: municipal infractions get to be a costly affair. Ordinances as adopted by other cities regarding such animals were discussed. Council member Conrad had left a letter outlining his views, in that he was unable to be present at this meeting.

Mayor Glandon said he personally feels it would be better to look at an Ordinance instead of a nuisance, so the owner cannot replace one animal with a like animal. City Attorney John Wehr agreed, and suggested they start with the definition of vicious animals. He asked about excepting the Sale Barn. Council member Mendenhall said those are domestic animals. Mr. Wehr replied that certain dogs can be vicious, and should the Sale Barn be addressed within the confines of an auction facility? Mayor Glandon asked for comments from the public. Willis Jaacks said a lot of people visiting from out-of-town won't know what it is about. John Wehr said the Ordinance would cover within the boundaries of the City and the law would have to be administered and enforced. Ron Kerr asked how close to the City the Ordinance may be enforced? Someone thought it might be two miles, but Mr. Wehr said that had to do with platting and subdivisions, but the Ordinances would be restrictive within the boundaries of the City. Willis Jaacks asked if snakes would be included in the prohibited Ordinance. Mayor Glandon said yes. John Wehr asked about giraffes? He also said we have to be very careful about vagueness in a municipal Ordinance: that Des Moines had problems with their Dog Ordinance by using the words "similar characteristics." Mayor Glandon reminded the group that once we get an Ordinance in place it could always be amended if a problem arose. He further suggested we have two Council members and the new Mayor work with the City Attorney to refine a drafted Ordinance, and asked if there were any

Fellow Council members and Public,

In regard to the agenda item concerning Concerned Neighbors re: Vicious Animals, I wanted to offer the following;

I believe that the current situation is a nuisance because of the containment, or lack of containment, of the animals owned by Finchs, not the mere presence of the animals. I am unaware that Finchs ever involved the City, or their neighbors, in their plans to place exotic, and potentially dangerous, animals within the city limits of Sigourney.

The animals in question are not properly contained, which was evidenced by the recent escape of the bears. Efforts are being made to upgrade the cages and pens, but said efforts do not appear to be timely. Specific requirements for cages and pens should be set. There appears to be a history of various animals owned by Finchs roaming at large.

These animals deserve cages large enough and clean enough to give them a comfortable living area. In addition, the public deserves to be comfortable and enjoy the use of their private property. Finch's neighbors should not have to worry about potentially dangerous animals roaming onto their private property. Although the animals normal behavior may be nonaggressive, I would not be willing to guarantee that they would remain nonaggressive under all the situations that they may encounter if they escape from their pens.

I did not inquire into the availability of one of the owners to be present on the property twenty-four hours a day, and believe that circumstances (such as the storm during the summer of 1998) will continue to arise that are not under the owner's control. The public needs to be confident that the animals will be contained under all circumstances. I would suggest that the current situation be declared a nuisance, and that specific guidelines for cages and fencing be set by the Council and met by Finchs. I believe all the animals should be contained within double fencing, that said fencing should extend at least two feet below the surface of the ground, that the separate cages for each species be sufficiently far apart to limit contact between species that do not get along, and that each cage be sufficiently large to allow for the comfort and shelter of the animals contained therein. I believe that every time any violation occurs, or anytime Finchs license is suspended, a municipal infraction would exist.

of personal time.

I also expect the usual benefits and insurance to be paid at the end of November for the month of December. The precedent on that was previously set when another employee left early in the month in which coverage was already paid.

I certainly plan to have the annual financial report completed, published and in the mail during November, but if there are other loose ends to tie up, or if Angie and Sherrie need help in the office before the position is filled, I could help a day or so. I would always be glad to answer questions on the phone.

volunteers. Council member Van Fleet volunteered. The consensus of opinion was that Mayor Glandon ought to be the other Council member to serve on this Committee inasmuch as he has familiarized himself with animal ordinances from other cities and that he has been actively involved in this problem since the first complaint. Of course, he said his term as Council member would be completed at the end of the year, but was reminded that the first draft of the Ordinance should be completed before that time. He did agree to help on the Committee.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that Council members Glandon and Van Fleet work with Mayor-elect John I. Ballensky and the City Attorney to draft the proposed Vicious Animal Ordinance. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved. Ron Kerr said he thinks it is great that the Council is going to take action.

Mayor Glandon said the City Council has discussed for several years the possibility of having an Administrator or Public Works Director to run the City more on a day-to-day basis. In that Beth Danowsky has moved back to Sigourney and is the Executive Director of the Rural Development Council of the Iowa Department of Economic Development, John Wehr suggested that she might lend the City some help on that topic. Beth told the Council of her professional background and said although this is not currently in her areas of responsibility, she was in a position to obtain some resource material and would share with them her knowledge of the position of City Manager or Administrator in other cities of comparable sizes to Sigourney. She had several handouts which included Salary & Benefit Surveys for the years 1998 and 1999 for that position from selected Cities, Admission and Graduate Requirements for Public Administration Degrees from the University of Northern Iowa and Iowa State University, and Guide to the Process of Preparing Job Descriptions for your City or County. She said there are a lot of resources available, and that we should take a hard look at the job duties, and budget considerations, and that the Institute of Public Affairs at the University of Iowa will come in and help sort through the process, and they operate under a grant. In her opinion that is a very good idea to go through that process of a Public Management Assistant to help evaluate the potential position. Mayor Glandon asked if there were any questions? Kenneth Bucklin asked Beth if the City went through the Public Management Assistant program what other benefits might be expected? She said it is a stressful process for the City staff and worth it to have someone come in and work with the employees to make a smooth transition. She said it is important for everyone to agree on the decisions made, that any failures she has been aware of have been because of a lack of total agreement. Mayor Glandon asked about how we get involved in participation. She said to call Sue Lambert and either Pat Callahan or Tim Shields would be the consultants on site. Mayor Glandon said to wait until after the first of the year. Ken Bucklin suggested involving both the new and old Council. John Ballensky asked about setting it up now for after the first of the year. She said she would ask Sue Lambert to call us, since their offices are next to each other.

Council member Van Fleet said he had nothing to report on Memorial Hall.

On Park and Recreation, Council member Van Fleet said he put the basketball courts in operation last weekend. He would like to move the fence and gate on the north side of the Park to the West 80'-100' and plan to make a parking area. The pool chemical people could also use the parking instead of the grass.

Mayor Glandon reported the new end loader will be here tomorrow. Don Northup told the group that the electrical is all in the new building as planned. Also, they had talked with both Wells and Goldman about hanging heaters or radiant heaters (which would be good with the opening and shutting), and they would like to get permission to take bids from local contractors. Jerry Smithart said the DOT has told him that their radiant heat is better than blowers. Mayor Glandon said he feels they should go ahead and get quotes

from local contractors. Council member Wilkening asked about radiant heat cost versus hanging; if it would be a wash, he would prefer radiant heat. Mayor Glandon asked Don Northup to talk with the local contractors, Wells, Goldman, Wallerich, and Bates, and get their representatives' recommendations.

Don Northup also reported there are two places on streets where people drive around: at the intersection of Elm and Stone, there is a spot raised about 4" or 5", and also on Spring Street in front of Bob and Deb Schauf's. He estimates it will take \$2700-\$3000 to fix both. There may be several other spots for consideration later, but these are the worst right now. Mayor Glandon said he doesn't feel the Street Department has to come back to him, but go ahead and get those two places repaired before the weather changes.

Mayor Glandon said he had talked with Phil Buschmann today and that he said he was in the process of settling his claim with Sammon Construction Co.'s insurance company.

John Wehr advised that the Planning & Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing at noon on Tuesday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, at the Council Chamber, in regard to amendments to the City Zoning Ordinance. Assuming they take action to recommend an amendment it will need to be on the agenda for the next Council meeting, after seven days notice, which the City Attorney will handle.

Ken Bucklin asked John Wehr about the status of Easements for test wells. Mr. Wehr said letters were sent out about Easements, but nothing has been returned. He had with him an Engineering Services Agreement to do the test wells. Roy Hesemann is now working for the City of Cedar Rapids on their wells, but he will still work with the City of Sigourney to finish out our test wells. He handed out a letter from Roy recommending two sites, both on Matt Wehr's. Roy wanted to be specific about the type of wells and equipment used. There are two types of drilling rigs: 1.) rotary, and 2.) cable tool rig. He prefers the cable tool rig even though it drills more slowly but is a cleaner drilling. His first choice of drillers was Aqua Drill and they had quoted \$15,600, but they couldn't get to it before March. Mr. Bucklin read the cost estimate of Shawver Well Company, Inc. of Fredericksburg-Dyersville, which totaled \$15,101, and they would deduct \$500 for a second well; the proposal of Northway Well and Pump Company was \$15,740, and they would deduct \$900 for the second well. The big savings would be in engineering costs for two instead of one, and for their fee of \$8600 for two wells, whereas one well would only be \$600 less. He had prepared an Engineering Services Agreement in the total amount of \$38,300 to cover their services for two wells, and the proposal of Shawver Well Company drilling two test wells at \$29,700. The engineers would be hiring the well driller and would not add on anything to their cost. However, if they should encounter sand a ten inch temporary casing would have to be put in at an added cost of \$1000. One well, for both the engineers and driller, would total \$23,100. Engineer Bucklin explained the abandonment of the test wells, and also said that there is always a chance of them being dry wells. Mayor Glandon said at this point we need one more well. Council member Van Fleet asked what the total cost would be for one more production well. Mr. Bucklin replied between \$50,000-\$80,000 per well. He also added that production well(s) wouldn't be drilled until after July 1st, so there would also be damages for cropland for laying pipe.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that the City go ahead with two test wells included in the Engineering Services Agreement, and approve the same. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Also under the Water Department, Council member Wilkening brought up the matter of Ron Doubek having told him that he loaned the geophones to a local contractor many months ago and they have never been returned. (Bill Tremmel) Mayor Glandon said he will talk with him tomorrow. Council member Wilkening added that the same contractor had borrowed a valve, etc. and has not replaced the same or made payment therefor. Don

Northup reminded the Council that after a project contractor borrowed our maintainer, that written notice was distributed that no City equipment is to be loaned to anyone. Mayor Glandon said he will talk with the contractor who purportedly has borrowed the items of equipment about which Doubek told Council member Wilkening.

There was no report from the Wastewater Department

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the error on Sherrie Casper's pay increase after her probationary period, be corrected retroactively to September 4, 1999 at .25 per hour, making her hourly rate \$8.00 per hour from that date forward. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Council member Wilkening moved, seconded by Council member Van Fleet, that the resignation of Peggy Kleinschmidt, as City Clerk, effective at the end of the office day November 24th, be accepted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved. She was instructed to place an ad in the paper November 10th and 17th that resumes, addressed to the attention of the Mayor, will be accepted through November 20th, and that they will plan to have someone in the position by December 1st.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Wilkening, that the claims be approved as submitted, after the addition of \$25.00 for Mayor Ballensky's enrollment in the budget planning seminar. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

Mayor Glandon told the group that presuming there are no problems with the canvass of votes tomorrow, that John I. Ballensky will take the Oath of Office as Mayor at 12:30 P.M. Friday, November 5, 1999.

Council member Van Fleet moved, seconded by Council member Mendenhall, that Douglas L. Glandon return to and be appointed to his seat as Third Ward Council member upon the newly elected Mayor taking the Oath of office. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Mendenhall, Winn, Wilkening, and Van Fleet. Nays: None. The motion was approved.

John Ballensky asked to make a few comments. He said he would like to see the City proceed and expand and it will be necessary for everyone to work together as a team and be winners for the City; that he and the Council would be the captains representing the City and hopefully the citizens would follow. He added that he wants everyone to be courteous and be nice, and refer any complaints to him.

Council member Van Fleet moved for adjournment at 8:35 P.M. The second was by Council member Winn.
