#### City Council Minutes

#### November 5, 1980

The City Council met in a regular scheduled Council meeting November 5, 1980 at 7:30 O'clock P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall Building as published and posted. Mayor Deitrich presided with the following Councilmen answering roll call; Butler, Kerr, H. Seip, J. Seip, Van Fleet, Aldrich.

Councilman Van Fleet made the motion, seconded by Councilman Kerr that the minutes of the regular meeting of October 15, 1980 be approved as presented. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

August Bowers was before the Council in regard to the cutting of his driveway curb on East Elm St. He was advised that this would be done as soon as possible that we also had another one which needed to be cut.

Councilman Van Fleet made the motion, seconded by Councilman Kerr that Kevin deRegnier's pool report for the 1980 season be approved. This report being made a part of these minutes.

Councilman Butler made the motion, seconded by Councilman H. Seip that the General Telephone Co. of the Midwest be allowed to move the 13 poles back as they requested. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

Councilman H. Seip made the motion, seconded by Councilman Butler that Earle "Barney" Fear be given \$100.00 for 6 months for maintenance of his mowers as park custodian. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

At 8:00 O'clock P.M. it was announced that it was the time for the Hearing on Tax Moratorium. There were no written or oral objectors at the hearing. At 8:15 the hearing was closed.

Councilman H. Seip made the motion, seconded by Councilman Aldrich that the resolution on the Stoner Sub-division be approved as per the Planning Commission approval. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

Councilman Butler made the motion, seconded by Councilman Van Fleet that the resolution ordering preparation of final plat and schedule of assessments be approved. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

Councilman Van Fleet made the motion, seconded by Councilman H. Seip that the Said Krause addition aub-division be sent to the Sigourney Planning and Zoning Commission for their approval to be returned to City Council by the next regular Council meeting which is November 19, 1980. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

Dan Phillips, Sigourney High School instructor, was present and presented a proposal for an ice skating rink that would be built on the old high school football field. The Council agreed to co-operate with the school and the local Kiwanis club in making a rink for the public use in the winter. Mayor Deitrich appointed Councilman Butler to work on this project with them.

The letter from Ken Bucklin, County Engineer was read and discussed and Mayor Deitrich stated that he would talk to Ken Bucklin about the different roads involved.

Construction of portland cement concrete pavement with integral curb, together with necessary grading, incidental street drainage facilities, and miscellaneous related work. The pavement shall be 25 feet wide back-to-back of curb and 6 inches thick, except when otherwise noted on the following streets to-wit:

#### SECTION 1

Clark Street: From the existing return at Main Street west 1,266 feet.

#### SECTION 2

<u>Shuffleton Street</u>: From the existing return at Ringold Street north 402 feet.

#### SECTION 3

Ringold Street: From the existing return at East Street east 1,538 feet, including return at Warren Street.

<u>Warren Street</u>: From the existing north curb line of Jackson Street to the south line of Ringold Street.

#### SECTION 4

Elm Street: From the existing east curb line of Shuffleton Street to the existing return at East Street; from the existing curb line east side of East Street 1,435 feet east, including returns at Warren Street, Laffer Street, May Street.

Assessments shall be based on paving 6 inches thick and 25 feet wide. Adjustments will be made for the cost per benefit point for the 22 foot paving.

Special assessment deficiencies as set forth in the Schedule of Assessments are conditionally levied and are certified pursuant to Code Section 384.63 and applicable ordinances. The period for amortization of special assessment deficiencies established by ordinance is ten years.

Assessments may be paid in full or in part at the office of the City Clerk, within thirty days of the filing of this certificate.

# NO ARBITRAGE CERTIFICATE CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA

This No Arbitrage Certificate is made by the Treasurer and the chief financial officer of Sigourney, Iowa, (the "Issuer") and may be relied upon for purposes of Section 103(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (the "Code"), relating to arbitrage bonds. The undersigned has made an investigation of facts, estimates and circumstances pertaining to and in connection with the issuance of \$870,000 Sigourney, Iowa General Obligation Bonds, dated December 1, 1980 (the "Bonds") which are to be issued and delivered simultaneously with this certificate. On the basis of this investigation, the undersigned certifies that the Issuer reasonably expects as follows.

On the date of issue of the Bonds, the purchaser at the public sale will purchase the Bonds for \$870,000, plus premium of none, plus accrued interest on the Bonds to the date of closing and payment for the Bonds. Said amounts constitute the original proceeds of the issue as used herein. Said accrued interest will be deposited in the debt service fund for application to the first interest payment on the Bonds on June 1, 1981. The remaining proceeds will be applied in accordance with Divisions B & C following. The price paid by the purchasers (underwriters) of the Bonds is reasonable under customary standards applicable in the market.

Division B. With respect to Bonds and the original proceeds thereof in the amount of \$ , issued for the purpose of refunding outstanding obligations consisting of construction warrants, to-wit:

1. The Bonds are issued for the purpose of refunding outstanding obligations of the Issuer to the extent of the above amount of the issue for the purpose of paying costs of street improvements within the City. The Issuer has incurred a substantial binding obligation to accomplish said refunding. The refunding will proceed with due diligence to completion. No other obligations of the Issuer other than remaining portions of said issue herein described are being issued at substantially the same time that the Bonds are being issued, sold pursuant to a common plan of financing, and paid out of substantially the same source of funds.





- 2. The spendable original proceeds of the Bonds issued for the refunding will be expended for said refunding by the date of the delivery of said Bonds to the purchaser against payment.
- 3. The yield on the Bonds is computed to be 8.5446 percent. No obligations are expected to be acquired with the original proceeds and the yield of the Acquired Obligations which are to be allocated to said original proceeds of this bond issue shall not exceed said rate. Yield is determined by the actuarial method, on the basis of semiannual interest compounding, and said rate produces a present worth of all payments of principal and interest which is less than the purchase price described in the second paragraph of this certificate.
- 4. The original proceeds of this issue (or the portion thereof to which this division of this certificate applies) will not exceed (by more than one percent) the amount necessary for the purpose of said refunding.
- 5. None of the proceeds of the Bonds will be invested in higher yield Acquired Obligations pursuant to any temporary period provided in Section 1.103-14(e)(3) of the proposed Income Tax Regulations (the "Proposed Regulations") under Section 103(c) of the Code. Funds accumulated in the debt service fund for the payment of the Bonds and interest will be held, invested and disbursed within a period of less than twelve months and any amounts earned upon investments will within one year of receipt be commingled for accounting for expenditures with other revenues from the operations of the Issuer which are substantial in amount. The Issuer does not expect to pay principal or interest on the Bonds from any other fund.
- 6. As of the date of this No Arbitrage Certificate, all original proceeds of the obligations together with earnings upon the investment thereof for a temporary period have been expended for their purpose.
- 7. In the calculation of the yields stated above no adjustments were made to reflect the administrative costs of issuing, carrying and repaying the Bonds.
- 8. Property financed with the proceeds of the obligations to be refunded will not be sold or disposed of, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity date of either the obligations or the last maturity of the Bonds.

9. All of the proceeds of the obligations to be refunded were used to provide facilities used in the regular operations of the Issuer and neither the facilities nor the output thereof have been or are expected to be used in the trade or business of any person other than the Issuer.

\* \* \*

Division C. With respect to original proceeds of the Bonds in the amount of \$\(\) (not issued for the purpose of refunding outstanding obligations), and to be used to acquire a project described as street improvements within the City, to-wit:

- 1. The Issuer will within six months of the date of the issue (the date on which said Bonds are issued, delivered, and paid for) of said Bonds incur a substantial binding obligation to acquire the project financed by said Bonds and exceeding two and one-half percent of the cost of acquiring said project. Work has been completed as of November 1, 1980.
- 2. Not less than eighty-five percent of the principal proceeds of the Bonds is expected to be expended for project costs, including the reimbursement of other funds expended to date by thirty-six months from the earlier of the respective issue date of the bonds or the first interim temporary obligations issued to fund the project and replaced by the bonds; and all of such proceeds are expected to be expended for the purpose of the project by
- 3. Said Bonds are not issued in whole or in part to pay any principal or interest of a prior issue of governmental obligations.
- 4. The project will not be sold or otherwise disposed of, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the Bonds.
- 5. The original proceeds of this issue will not exceed the amount necessary for the purpose or purposes of the issue.

Funds accumulated in the debt service fund created in the bond resolution for the payment of the Bonds and interest will be held, invested and fully disbursed within a period less than twelve months and any amounts earned upon such investment will within one year of receipt be commingled for accounting and expenditure with other revenues from the operations of the

Issuer which are substantial in amount. The Issuer does not expect to pay principal or interest on the Bonds from any other fund or to establish any sinking fund or other similar fund for the Bonds.

On the basis of all the facts, estimates and circumstances now in existence and set forth in the documents relating to the issuance of the Bonds, including without limitation this No Arbitrage Certificate, it is now expected that the proceeds of the Bonds will not be used in a manner that would cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 103(c) of the Code and the Regulations thereunder.

This certificate is being executed and delivered pursuant to Sections 1.103-13, 1.103-14, and 1.103-15 of the income tax regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, (the "Regulations") and the undersigned is an officer charged by law and by resolution of the governing body of the Issuer with the responsibility of issuing the bonds. The terms used in this certificate have the same meaning as those terms which are used in Section 103(c) of the Code and the Regulations, which are to the extent of said definitions incorporated herein by reference.

To the best of our knowledge and belief the Issuer's expectations stated herein are reasonable and there are no other facts, estimates or circumstances that would materially change the foregoing expectations. No matters have come to our attention which make unreasonable or incorrect the representations made in this certificate.

It is further certified that said Issuer has never been listed by the Internal Revenue Service of the United States or the Commissioner thereof as not to be relied upon with respect to certification in connection with the issuance of its obligations.
