CITY OF SIGOURNEY, IOWA REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 1986

The Sigourney City Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers of the Memorial Hall on Wednesday, November 5, 1986, at 7:30 o'clock p.m., as posted. Mayor Deitrich presided at the meeting with the following Councilmen answering roll call: Clawson, Park, H. Seip, J. Seip, and Butler. Kerr was absent.

Also present were Jerry Long, P.E. with French-Reneker-Associates; City employees Harold Woods and Harold Hemsley; Barb Drake, writer for The Ottumwa Courier; and Mike Jaeger representing The Oskaloosa Herald. Fred Hensel, CPA, arrived at 7:45 p.m.

Councilman J. Seip moved, seconded by Councilman Park, that the minutes of the meetings of October 15, 1986 and October 29, 1986, be approved as submitted. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Clawson, Park, H. Seip, J. Seip, and Butler. Nays: None.

Employees Woods and Hemsley were called before the Council to outline to them certain rules and regulations that will be followed at the new Sewer Lagoon Plant recently accepted: requested tests will be done on time and initialed by the person taking them; the facility is to be kept clean and the screens are to be kept clean; the dumpster used; the building dusted and swept, the equipment kept clean; immediately report anything not working properly; drive only on gravel (don't tear up soft ground) - it has taken every available cent for the City to pay for this project and it was accepted in a neat and orderly condition and the administration expects it to remain the same.

Jerry Long discussed the problem with one property owner (C. D. Huffman) having not signed an easement for Phase I of the Water Improvement Project to Louis Rich, and after phone conversations with the City Attorney, the Mayor asked the Council if there would be any objections if the property owners were paid \$200.00 for easement considerations. There were no objections (no voting action.) Long advised the EDA and DOT have approved the plans and that if this matter of the easements could be resolved quickly, it could go to bid letting at the next Council meeting; with a total project cost of \$165,000, with construction cost thereof estimated at \$132,560.

Councilman Butler introduced the following Resolution:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Notice of public hearing and letting on proposed drawings, specifications, form of contract, and estimated cost for proposed waterworks improvements - Louis Rich Rural Water EDA #05-01-02224, for the City of Sigourney, Iowa, be received in the form of sealed bids by the City Council of the City of Sigourney, Iowa at the City Hall in said City until 8:00 p.m., Wednesday, November 19, 1986.

The Resolution was seconded by Councilman Park, and upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Clawson, Park, H. Seip, J. Seip, and Butler. Nays: None.

Further discussion was held regarding the next Phase of construction.

The Mayor advised the Council that he had had conversation with Dale Crouse, Pathfinders, The Resource Conservation and Development Area, who felt we only have a 10% chance of obtaining a grant for the West sewerage treatment plant, whereas Kenneth Bucklin, P.E. with French-Reneker-Associates, felt we would have a 50%-50% chance for such grant. Inasmuch as there would be no charge to the City unless we do in fact obtain a grant, the Mayor asked if there would be any objections in having French-Reneker go ahead and write the grant application. There was no objection (no voting action.)

Fred Hensel, C.P.A., was before the Council and reviewed with the Mayor and City Council page-by-page the Auditor's Report on Financial Statements and supplemental information comments and recommendations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986. -2- Continuation of Regular Council Meeting Wednesday, November 5, 1986

Councilman Clawson moved, seconded by Councilman H. Seip, that the claims be approved as presented. Upon the roll being called, the following voted: Ayes: Clawson, Park, H. Seip, J. Seip, and Butler. Nays: None

The Mayor advised the Council of a Department of Environmental Quality Air and Land Quality Division Report of an Open Burning Incident which occurred October 30, 1986 and read to them the complaint record. The assessment of a civil penalty as determined by the Court, may be up to five thousand dollars per day. In that we cannot afford such assessment the Mayor advised the Council that he took it upon himself to put a notice in the paper advising of no dumping at the City yards until further notice. Various alternatives to the problem were discussed, but no decision was made at this meeting.

Discussion was had regarding a truck inspected this week by Councilmen Butler and Park and employee Fred Snakenberg, and it was felt that nothing should be done about a truck until after the first of the year.

Councilman H. Seip moved for adjournment at 9:05 p.m.
